1) What heritage items do we hold?

The Welsh National Temple of Peace and Health is home to a number of collections of archived papers and heritage objects which relate to the building itself, and the many organisations which have operated there over a period of 80 years.

The temple building is an unusual example of secular modernist design, created by Cardiff-based architect Percy Thomas, and built in the 1930s. Many of the original fixtures, fittings and period objects remain in the building. Changes to the building, including reconstruction following a bombing incident in the 1960s, can be traced in the archived papers of the caretaker organisations.

The organisations that have called the building 'home' over the years all follow in the footsteps of the founder's twin aims of 'peace', and 'health'. Archived papers from these organisations tell the story of remarkable people who had a vision to create a fairer world, in Wales and beyond. From peace-making after World War I, to humanitarian fundraising in the 1970s, the content of this unique archive will provide new avenues for both research and audience activities, across a variety of sectors and disciplines.

a) Archives (paper)

The WCIA holds the archives of several organisations that have been based in the temple building. These archives are primarily made up of working papers, as well as some photographs and prints. The majority of these archives are boxed and numbered, and are currently stored in the temple attic (see, Archive Box List [attic]). Approximately 20 boxes of miscellaneous materials are also temporarily stored in Cardiff University Special Collections.

c) Publications

The attic houses a small back-catalogue of print-runs such as books, DVDs and posters, some of which have been published by the WCIA. The attic also houses a variety of reference books on topics relevant to the work of the WCIA.

The Council Chamber houses a library of books relevant to the work of WCIA. Publications range from the early-20th century to the present day. At least some of the publications held by the WCIA would not be considered as unique items eligible for archive deposit however, some may be considered for deposit in a reference library. A small number may be example of rare books and could go into a special collection library.

d) Memorials

The Garden of Peace is home to a selection of trees, plants, and memorial objects sponsored by a variety of organisations from 1988 onwards. The WCIA are caretakers of the memorials although they do not hold legal ownership of the garden.

There are a number of other memorials throughout the building which may also need to be considered.

2) How much storage space do our heritage items use?

The majority of paper archives are stored in standard sized office archive boxes (not conservation grade) measuring a maximum of 50cm (depth) x 40cm (width) x 30cm (height). Not all of the boxes are full and some could be transferred to smaller boxes if cataloguing were to take place. The table below is a reflection of items housed at the temple which may be considered as heritage collections, however, not all of the material would be eligible for transfer to an accredited archive. Storage estimates have been given based on a maximum box width of 40cm, or based on current shelving space used.

3) What research areas do our archive and reference material cover?

The section below gives some examples of topics/subject areas which may be of interest for current and future researchers and other audiences.

a) Welsh National Temple of Peace and Health

We hold a number of items related to the Temple of Peace opening day, November 1938, as well as documents which relate to the early years of its operation. This material is especially useful for those wishing to find out more about the original aims of the temple and how it was established. We have a variety of material related to changes to the building and its uses over the years. We also hold a selection of the writings of temple founder David Davies as well as a small number of writings about David Davies by other authors.

Making connections...

Dr Emma West at Birmingham University is exploring the establishment and opening of the temple as part of her post-doctoral research funded by the British Academy entitled: *Revolutionary Red Tape: How state bureaucracy shaped British modernism*. The project, 'examines how public servants and official committees helped to commission, disseminate and popularise British modernist art, design, architecture and literature': <https://goo.gl/sXgggY>. Dr West has already accessed our archive and worked with Wales for Peace and curator Mari Lowe to create new interpretations of the temple for visitors.

Dr Robert Proctor of the University of Bath is currently writing a book on temple architect Percy Thomas. He has delivered talks on topics including, 'Percy Thomas: Modern Architecture as National Service': <https://goo.gl/VYL4TM>. Dr Proctor has already accessed our archive and attended an open day delivered by Dr Emma West and Mari Lowe.

Cardiff Civic Society recently supported a funding bid by Mari Lowe to explore public engagements with Cardiff Civic Centre. Members of the Civic Society are highly invested in the temple and the Civic Centre, and they are keen to support initiatives which highlight this important conservation area.

The David Davies Memorial Institute at Aberystwyth University holds a good collection of the writings of temple founder David Davies. It would be useful to explore where the temple's holdings cross over with theirs.

b) League of Nations Union & United Nations Association

We have a limited amount of material which relates to the League of Nations Union, Welsh National Council (LNU-WNU) which was based at the temple between 1938 and 1947. Much of the work of the League of Nations in Wales pre-dates the Temple of Peace and is deposited in other archives such as the National Library of Wales.

We also hold some material which is not unique to the LNU-WNC but would have been vital to its work. Publications include those from the League of Nations (Geneva), the League of Nations Union (Great Britain) in London, as well as the Scottish League of Nations. These include copies of books, pamphlets, newsletters, and journals released by

the League of Nations and League of Nations Union but are not unique to Wales. Some of these may be available in other libraries and archives.

In 1945 the United Nations Association, Welsh National Council (UNA-WNC) was formed, superseding the LNU-WNC. While the League of Nations Union in Wales pre-dated the Temple of Peace, the United Nations Association in Wales was very much connected to the building and we have a good selection of material from the inaugural meeting in 1945 to the early 2000s. As the council for Wales, the UNA also hold reports from various branches across Wales.

Making connections...

Dr Tomas Irish at Swansea University has recently contacted us about our holdings related to the League of Nations Union in Wales. His current research examines, 'the role of intellectuals, intellect, and expertise in the conceptualisation of peace in inter-war Europe, with a particular focus on the League of Nations': <https://goo.gl/rzZxKC>.

The National Library of Wales holds a significant archive on the League of Nations Welsh National Council which pre-dates the opening of the building: League of Nations Union and United Nations Association Records (Wales), 1922-1959: <https://goo.gl/xFGhSM>.

Material from the 1920s is especially significant in relation to women peace activists. Link to other archives include Bangor Archives who have holdings related to activists including Gwladys Thoday and the Women's Peace Petition, 1925.

c) History of international youth volunteering

The United Nations Association in Wales worked alongside its youth service called the UNA International Youth Service. Later on UNA Exchange was established in 1984 to coordinate international youth exchanges.

This area of our archive is less well-developed but there is huge scope to explore the history of post-war volunteering and how that lead to some of the volunteering organisations we have today in Wales and beyond.

Making connections...

Organisations which may benefit from understanding their heritage include UNA Exchange and volunteering communities in Cardiff and beyond such as VCS. We would also like to use these collections to explore Wales' international connections.

This subject area also holds a lot of scope for projects on volunteering and well-being. The heritage of volunteering is a growing area contributing to an increased awareness of why and how people volunteer. Organisations that have successfully explored similar topics include Royal Voluntary Service and VCS Cymru (Chronicle project).

d) History of international education

International Education has been an important part of the work of the temple, not only in providing volunteer and learning opportunities but also in advocating for the inclusion of international topics in schools. This has happened through a number of groups and organisations including the League of Nations Union (Advisory Education Committee), the Welsh Association for Education in World Citizenship (WAEWC) and also the Council for Education in World Citizenship (CEWC), which in Wales became CEWC-Cymru.

The Welsh Centre for International Affairs (WCIA) was established in 1973 and continues the tradition of providing and advocating for international education, in formal and informal settings.

Making connections...

Gwilym Davies set up the Welsh School of Social Sciences and was central to the Advisory Education Committee of the League of Nations. Papers of Gwilym Davies' can be found at the National Library of Wales: <https://goo.gl/hruvJY>.

Volunteers from Wales for Peace have tried to research this area but it has been difficult to give them access to archive material. Currently, the collections most relevant to our volunteers are at National Library Wales, Aberystwyth.

e) History of humanitarian aid and international development

The Freedom from Hunger Campaign was active in Wales during the 1960s and was an important milestone in the direction of the temple's international work. With the establishment of the WCIA in 1973 the temple increasingly became a hub for international partnerships and projects.

Projects from major international charities have been based at the temple over the years including Oxfam and UNICEF. More recently the temple has been home to Hub Cymru Africa and Fairtrade Wales.

As with the history of international volunteering, this area of our archive is less well-developed but there is huge scope to explore the history of aid and development in Wales and beyond.

Making connections...

Organisations which may benefit from an increased awareness and confidence in their heritage include WCIA, Hub Cymru Africa, Dolen Cymru and UNA Exchange. We would also like to use these collections to explore Wales' international connections and diaspora communities.

Students from Cardiff University's International Relations courses regularly come to the temple for volunteering placements. It has been very difficult to give these students access to archive material which would enhance their research skills and inspire new project ideas.

4) Next steps

a) Cataloguing

Work has been carried out by volunteers to catalogue sections of the archive and library but we do not know how comprehensive these lists are. The current lists are: Archive Box List (attic); Archive Database (Cardiff University); Library Database (Council Chamber).

Before cataloguing, a scoping study could be carried out to confirm legal ownership of items, to identify items to keep (e.g. working papers), to identify items for deposit (i.e. into an archive), and to identify items for disposal (give away, or destroy). Challenges include a lack of space to carry out the work, the presence of multiple copies many of items, and also the fact that unique items (e.g. letters) are mixed in with reference publications.

A large grant would be required for a professional archivist to catalogue the items if it is to be held in an accredited collection, such as Cardiff University Special Collections, for example. In order to carry out further preliminary work, in the form of a scoping study, it may be worth trying to acquire a smaller interim grant.

National Archives (London)

Garfield Weston

Cardiff University have been successful in getting funding from Garfield Weston. This funder has a museums and heritage strand, and also an education strand which may also be appropriate, depending on the aims of a cataloguing funding bid.

b) Caring for objects

Given the new ownership of the temple it will be important to establish legal ownership of items which are part of the building's history, or which are integral to the building. 3D objects which are at risk could be considered to be nominated for deposit in an accredited collection (museum/library/archive). The memorial objects in the Garden of Peace may also be considered as heritage items.

c) Reference library

WCIA has a rich holding of books and pamphlets in the attic and Council Chamber, as well as books held in individual offices. Some of these would not be suitable for deposit in an archive as they are publications which are readily available in other libraries. WCIA may consider establishing a reference library for use across organisations, for staff and volunteers.

Cataloguing was completed by volunteers at various stages of the Wales for Peace project but we are not sure if the lists are comprehensive.
